Pine Class

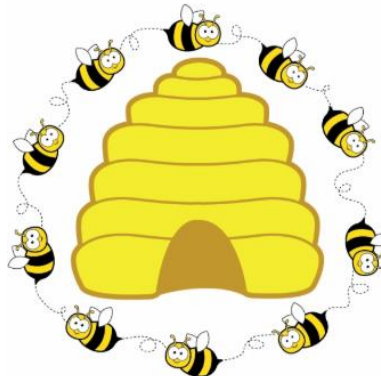
This week Year 5 have been designing our rockets and testing different ways of propelling them. They went incredibly high! We can't wait to start building!
